The fun of friendship

Empirical work carried out on the discourse of fun with young women at a British university showed that friends were a crucial part of their fun. Their activities often required company, and friends "made" the fun. However, these relationships were not unproblematically positive. Rather, they were complex and sometimes contradictory. This paper explores how young women's friendships can constrain as well as enable their fun.
