

Emma Sdegno graduated in English Language and Literature at Ca' Foscari University, attended the MA in "Literature and the Visual Arts, 1840-1940" at the University of Reading (UK), and did her Phd at Ca' Foscari University. During her post-graduate studies she particularly focused on Victorian criticism and John Ruskin's work, through a rhetorical approach. Her current interests concern the reception of Ruskin in 20th century France and Italy, and the representation of landscape in modern literature and theory.

She teaches English at Ca' Foscari University Venice. She has published on Victorian criticism, on the theory and history of translation and several essays on John Ruskin's rhetoric and style. She is now completing the book *The Kind Fire of Words: Ruskin's Landscape Rhetoric in Modern Painters*.
