Criteria for Peer Review of Proposals

Single Paper Proposals

Single paper proposals will be reviewed using the following criteria:

- 1. Relevance of the topic to the conference theme
- Explicit engagement with the issues raised in one or more of the think pieces provided by the keynote speakers
- 3. Robustness of the analytical or theoretical framework
- 4. Clarity of the research questions or focus of enquiry
- 5. Appropriateness of research methods and literature used
- 6. Reflexive discussion of the significance of the paper

Symposium Proposals

Symposium proposals will be reviewed using the following criteria:

- 1. Relevance of the topic to the conference theme
- 2. Explicit engagement with the issues raised in one or more of the think pieces provided by the keynote speakers
- 3. Coherence of the different elements of the symposium
- 4. Robustness of the analytical or theoretical framework(s)
- 5. Clarity of the research questions or foci of enquiry
- 6. Appropriateness of research methods and/or literature used
- 7. Reflexive discussion of the significance of the papers and/or the symposium as a whole.
- 8. Effective use of the 90 minute time slot
